Abberbury Road



The Church of Saint Mary the Virgin is one of Britain's finest examples of a late 12th-century Romanesque parish church, with an admired window by John Piper and an even newer stained-glass window by Roger Wagner.

Very notable too is the adjacent Old Parsonage with its tall Elizabethan chimneys and 13th- and 14th-century core, while scattered through the village are numerous attractive buildings of the 17th, 18th and early 19th centuries.



Iffley Church Hall, Church Way

Formerly a barn and then a school, the Hall is the centre of many Iffley activities and events, including the FOIV and FOSM summer and winter parties; music concerts and social events. There are new audiovisual and hearing assistance facilities, which are proving very useful for lectures and presentations. For more information and to make bookings, email:

Iffley is (in part) a Conservation Area

Iffley Meadows is a BBOWT nature reserve to protect the native Snakeshead Fritillaries which flower in the spring and is one of only three large national sites where this plant is found in large numbers. Local people and visitors from near and far can enjoy the famous church, the Conservation Area, the village pubs and hotels and the lovely location of Iffley Lock.

There are many bike paths and routes accessible only to cyclists and pedestrians.

The towpath leads into the City Centre via St Aldates and is an alternative for pedestrians and cyclists. In the summer months Salter's boats ply between Folly Bridge and Iffley, and on to Abingdon, and Iffley Meadows is a natural home for plants and wildlife.
